# Master of Science in Management

The Master of Science in Management has been developed and is taught by industry leaders, respected academic mentors, and program development experts committed to preparing the next generation of leaders in their industries. Its focus is to provide specialized degrees in the following concentrations: healthcare administration, nonprofit leadership, project management, strategic leadership, banking and finance, marketing management, operations management and real estate management. The program and concentrations are geared towards professionals who want to advance their careers and engage in more senior management activities and responsibilities. Students also have the opportunity to take concentrations that may help them enter new professional fields.

The program may range from one year to two years, according to the student's choice of schedule. Depending on the concentration, NEC offers the Management program in the Henniker campus, on various locations in New Hampshire and Maine, and online.

### Program Information

**Program Overview** The Master of Science in Management is a 36-credit program comprised of ten courses and a thesis/project requirement. The program may range from one year to two years, depending upon the student's choice of schedule. Eight concentrations are offered: healthcare administration, nonprofit leadership, project management, strategic leadership, banking and finance, marketing management, operations management and real estate management. The curriculum, always evolving, explores the challenges and opportunities of the current business climate and capitalizes on the climate of opportunity in New Hampshire and Northern New England. The

NEC School of Graduate and Professional Studies has formed partnerships with New Hampshire and Maine businesses, healthcare institutions and the nonprofits to offer the Master of Science in Management program on-site at their location. The M.S. in Management Strategic Leadership concentration is also offered on the Henniker Campus.

To apply, submit the online NEC Graduate School application ([www.nec.edu](http://www.nec.edu)), a current résumé, official college transcripts, a personal essay, and 2 letters of reference. No GRE scores are required. Applications will be accepted until the cohort is full. Cohorts begin in September and March each year.

# Financial Assistance Application Procedures

In order to be a Federal loan borrower, there are requirements you must complete.

Here is the process:

## 1. FAFSA

- Must be completed every academic year that you are enrolled and wish to utilize federal aid
- Go to [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov) and apply for a Federal PIN, if you do not have one or can't recall what it may be
  - Your PIN is used to E-Sign many school related documents, including your FAFSA—remember your number and keep it safe
- Go to [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) and click on the link to complete the FAFSA for the appropriate academic year (NEC school code: 002579):
  - Academic years run from July 1st to June 30th of the following year
  - FAFSAs expire on June 30th
  - Must have FULL LEGAL NAME AND correct social security number
  - Must be E-SIGNED, for FAFSA to be valid and by accepted by NEC
- If the Department of Education selects your Student Aid Report (SAR—Your FAFSA confirmation) you will need the following items:
  - SIGNED Federal Tax Returns and schedules (Tax year used to complete the FAFSA in question)
  - Federal W2s for everyone on the federal tax return
  - “Be Proactive” and verify that your SAR has no further holds that may prevent your funding from releasing to your account
- After you complete and submit a FAFSA it takes at least:
  - 1–3 business days for the Department of Education to process your submission
  - 1–3 weeks for the Department of Education to create a transmission of your information to be sent to the school(s) of your choice, for downloading and to be imported into the school's system

## 2. NEC Graduate Financial Aid Application

- Can always be located on the Student Financial Services section of the NEC website [www.nec.edu](http://www.nec.edu)
  - Click on the Student Financial Services link
  - Then the Applying for Financial Assistance link
  - Then the Application Form & Instructions link
  - Lastly, the Graduate, NEC+ and Online BA Students link, for the year you're attending
- Must be renewed every time the FAFSA is renewed
- Must contain the appropriate signatures to be accepted

## 3. Award Letters

- Award letters will be created once all necessary preliminary paperwork is received
  - Preliminary paperwork consists of:
    - FAFSA
    - NEC Graduate Financial Aid application
  - If either of these things are missing—we cannot produce an award
- Once the award is completed, a letter explaining the award, will be mailed out
- Students may always view their awards immediately, online via their MyNec account

## 4. Entrance Loan Counseling

  - Print your confirmation page for your records, once you complete your counseling

## 5. Federal Stafford Loan Master Promissory Note (MPN)

- A Federal Stafford Loan is *different* from the Graduate “PLUS” loan, which has a HIGHER interest rate than Unsubsidized loans. Don't make a mistake and apply for the PLUS loan in haste! It will only delay your funding.
- You will need your FAFSA PIN number to complete your Master Promissory Note (MPN)
- Plan on approximately 30 minutes to complete your Master Promissory Note (MPN) at <https://studentloans.gov>
- It is a FEDERAL requirement that we wait until after your add/drop period to begin the process of requesting your funds.
- After the certification process and after your add/drop period, it will take (approximately) 30 minutes for the loan to disburse to your student account.

## 6. Exit Loan Counseling

- Federal loan borrowers are required to complete Exit Loan Counseling when they have a break in enrollment or separation (ex. Graduate from program) from their institution.
