Move-In Weekend: Everything You Need To Know

New Students

First time NEC students will move in on Friday, August 29 between 8:00am and 12:00pm. Please start by checking in at the Center for Educational Innovation (CEI) located on Circle Street.

Once students have completed paperwork with the Wellness Center and Student Financial Services they will be ready to move into their residence hall. There will be plenty of friendly faces on campus to help.

Once students are moved in, we invite you to attend our Convocation ceremony in the Field House at 2:00pm, which marks the start of the new academic year. The entire NEC community, faculty, staff, and students assemble to celebrate the beginning of a new year and honor the academic achievements of its alumni members. Students will line up at 1:30pm on the Covered Bridge behind West Hall in preparation for Convocation. Immediately following the ceremony, families are invited to join Academic Affairs and Advancement for a reception in the Simon Center Great Room. By 4:00pm, we ask that parents and families say goodbyes and depart campus... we have a full Fall Orientation weekend planned for our new students!

Students living in Colby should report to the Colby Hall Office. Students who arrive after 5:00pm need to report to Campus Safety to pick up their room combinations and other check in information.
