# **Financial Aid Updates**

#### The 2025-2026 FAFSA is now open!

Apply for financial aid for the upcoming school year by completing your FAFSA today at studentaid.gov. before March 1.

#### What is FAFSA?

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is the application you need to complete each year to apply for financial aid to help pay for school.

#### Why should I file now?

- The FAFSA must be renewed annually.
- The 2025-2026 FAFSA is for classes starting after June 30, 2025.
- Some forms of financial aid are limited, so applying early increases your chances of receiving the maximum amount of aid.
- Submitting early allows you to focus on other aspects of attending college and removes the stress of last-minute planning.

#### Need help?

You can schedule an appointment to get in-person, phone or Zoom assistance with your FAFSA filing <u>here</u>.

#### **Work Study**

Did your student receive work study as part of their financial aid award package? To apply for a work study job, students visit <a href="nec.peopleadmin.com">nec.peopleadmin.com</a>, click log in/create account, the search student jobs. Through the work study program, students can earn money in a flexible part-time job on campus or in the community while gaining valuable work experience.

#### 1098-T Tuition Statements for Taxes Available in MyNEC January 31, 2025

A 1098-T form assists eligible students in determining if they qualify to claim an education tax credit on a tax return. The 1098-T form is an informational form and receipt of a 1098-T form does not imply eligibility for a tax credit. Depending on income (or family income for dependent students), whether enrolled full or half-time, and the amount of qualified educational expenses for the year, students may be eligible for a federal education tax credit. Detailed information about claiming education tax credits may be found in IRS Publication 970. 1098-T forms for eligible students are made available online in MyNEC and sent by mail by January 31. To view the form in MyNEC, navigate to 'Student Services & Financial Aid', 'Student Records', 'Tax Notification', '2024'. New England College prepares the 1098-T forms in compliance with IRS regulations; however, we cannot offer any tax advice. #### **Looking Back = Moving Forward with Confidence**

By the time you're reading this, we're in a new month (yay, February!) and a new semester (yay, spring!). We're all about looking forward, right? Well, yes, but a quick look back to fall semester might help students move forward with confidence. Help your student(s) with a quick reflective practice to assess the past and make positive and lasting changes moving forward.

#### Questions to ask your student(s):

#### How did you feel about last term?

\*This question is open-ended and designed to start the reflective practice. Did your student(s) enjoy their classes? What about them was enjoyable? Did your student(s) struggle in any classes? If so, in what ways? Encourage your student(s) to recap.

#### Did you feel last term was a successful one for you? Tell me more.

\*Keep in mind, "success" means something different to everyone. For one student, success might mean all As and Bs. For another, success might mean a passing grade in a really tough class. For others, success might not have anything to do with grades but, rather, a sense of overall growth and satisfaction.

#### If you could have a do-over, what might you change or do differently?

\*Here's the opening for setting goals and making changes. While every student is different, here are some options for changes/modifications based on responses:

Student Reflection/Comment	Potential Action Steps
I probably could have worked harder.	Ask: What does working harder look like for you this semester? Suggested action steps:  • Visit instructors' office hours  • Set up a study group with peers  • Meet with a tutor at the Writing and Academic Support Center
I struggled with managing my time. College is a lot different from high school.	<ul> <li>Use a planner/calendar/to-do list</li> <li>Create a schedule—and stick to it!</li> <li>Meet with a tutor for time management tips and strategies</li> <li>Work consistently with a tutor for accountability</li> </ul>
There's a lot to keep track of—it's kind of overwhelming	<ul> <li>Meet with a tutor to make sure you know where to look for course info (syllabus, Blackboard, e-texts, online platforms)</li> <li>Reach out to your instructor and/visit during office hours.</li> </ul>
Nothing, really. I felt good. Grades were good. I'm good. Everything's good!	Keep up the momentum and continue to use the strategies that have been working so far!

# **Mentoring Program Tips**

Welcome back! Spring semester classes begin on the 21st. A new year, new semester, new schedule, new classes, and new professors (oh my!) can all add up to new stressors. Remind your student to use the skills they've acquired so far. Start the semester strong by not missing classes early on (or at all), keeping course syllabi handy for reference, checking Blackboard, and their NEC email daily, and completing homework assignments as soon as possible. First-year students may need to refocus if their first college semester was a bumpy one. All is not lost though, and academic recovery is possible. Remind your student of all the support that is available in Advising, Mentoring, and Tutoring. If your student has been taking a Winter Term course, final assignments are on the horizon. Motivation may be waning. Encourage them to push through. Those credits will be worth the boost to their GPA and will help them stay on track toward degree completion.
