- Navigate to Registration
 - Click on the “Student Services and Financial Aid” tab
 - Click on “Registration”
 - Once in the registration module, click on “Register for Classes”
 - Select the correct term
 - Search for sections under Find classes tab. Leave fields blank to search all sections (if you already have a plan, go to next section)
- Add sections to your Summary
 - Find Classes: Click “Add” next to the desired section from the search results
 - Enter CRN: Add by CRN if known
 - Plans: If you already created a pre-registration plan, it will appear here. Click Add All or Add on a specific section from your plan.
- Once all desired classes are added, review the Schedule (calendar) at the bottom left pane to review for time conflicts.
- **Register by clicking Submit at the bottom right of the Summary pane**
 - Classes that are at the 5000-level or above are graduate courses and you may need permission to register
 - Errors (full courses, pre-requisites, etc) will appear in red and will require permission to override
 - To remove a course, use the drop down in the “Action” column and select “remove”, then hit “Submit” on the bottom right of the screen.
- Once registered, return to the registration menu and use the “View Registration Information” module to review your class schedule for the term.

HU 1990 How to Read Critically

The seminar plays a central role of guiding students on reading complex texts with care. Students will build upon their existing reading skills and comprehension and improve on the way they critically understand, evaluate, and summarize, which should help students in other courses and for their own capstone projects. Designed as a workshop, students will discuss texts and write very short assignments.

LAS 2140 Barbie: More Than Just a Doll

This course will provide students with an in depth look at Barbie as more than just a doll. How could 11.5 inches of plastic, weighing a mere 18.4 ounces become an international icon influencing art, pop culture, fashion, gender roles, body image, race, family values, and more? Can a doll really be this powerful? This course will include optional synchronous Zoom discussions.

TH 2990 Performing Arts in Society

Art is not a mirror held up to society, but a hammer with which to shape it." This quote from playwright Bertolt Brecht, who fled German Nazism and later fled American McCarthyism, will guide our study of the relationship between the performing arts and the quest for human rights. We will look at songwriters, playwrights, choreographers, musicians, protestors, and other performance artists using their bodies and voices to illuminate and/or change the society around them.
