COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS ARE AUTOMATICALLY ACCEPTED

Students who are enrolled in a community college and in good academic standing are automatically accepted to NEC. This program is open to any community college graduate in New England.

The transfer process doesn't have to be complicated. All courses completed at an accredited post-secondary institution with a grade "C-" or higher are transferable to NEC. Exceptions may be made for students who have completed an associate degree, allowing up to 16 credits of grades recorded as a "D" to be transferred.

If you are enrolled in a community college, you have already demonstrated that you want a successful and meaningful career. A bachelor's degree from NEC will set you up for future success.
