#### COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS ARE AUTOMATICALLY ACCEPTED

Students who are enrolled in a community college and in good academic standing are automatically accepted to New England College.

The transfer process doesn't have to be complicated. All courses completed at an accredited post-secondary institution with a grade "C-" or higher are transferable to New England College. Exceptions may be made for students who have completed an associate degree, allowing up to 16 credits of grades recorded as a "D" to be transferred.

If you are enrolled in a community college, you have already demonstrated that you want a successful and meaningful career. A bachelor's degree from New England College will set you up for future success.
