What is Academic Advising at NEC?

NEC has a shared advising model

- We offer students encouragement, support, and advice;
- Challenge students to set attainable goals;
- Assist students in realizing their academic potential;
- Help students as they create and leverage their student success plans



What to Expect from Your Advisor

You can expect your Academic Advisor to:

- Have establish office hours, be available for advising appointments, and expand hours during preregistration periods.
- Assist you to explore course offerings and career options by asking about your views, life goals and career interests, and by taking into account skills, academic performance, and the frequency of course offerings.
- Be familiar with the variety of degree and program offerings, departmental and core requirements.



First Year Student Success Plan

By creating your First Year Student Success Plan, you put yourself behind the wheel of your education and success by developing a personalized strategy for you to achieve your academic goals.

Your Academic Success Plan will help you to:

- 1. Understand your choice to pursue your education at NEC, your educational experiences, and the tools you can use to be successful.

- 3. Ensure you know who your Student Success Coach or advisor is, and how they can best assist you.

- 4. Click on Student Services and Financial Aid.
- 5. Click on Registration.
- 6. Click Add/Drop Classes
- 7. Make sure Fall 2020 (15 Weeks) is selected.
- 8. From here, you will see blank boxes at the bottom of the screen in which you can enter the CRNs for the courses you need to take. FAQs

When and what is Add/Drop?

The period at the beginning of a term when students can sign up for new courses and drop courses for which they were previously registered is the add/drop period. Dropping or adding classes can affect your financial aid, scholarship status, or tuition cost.

Should I withdraw from a class?

Withdrawing from classes should be done after consulting with an advisor.

Should I change my major?

This important decision is yours to make so before you do have, a conversation with your advisor and family.

I want to graduate early, what do I do?

 Maximizing the credits you take while NEC will help with this, in addition to taking classes in optional terms (winter and summer). If you GPA is 3.50 or higher, you can go up to 20 credits per semester at no additional cost.
