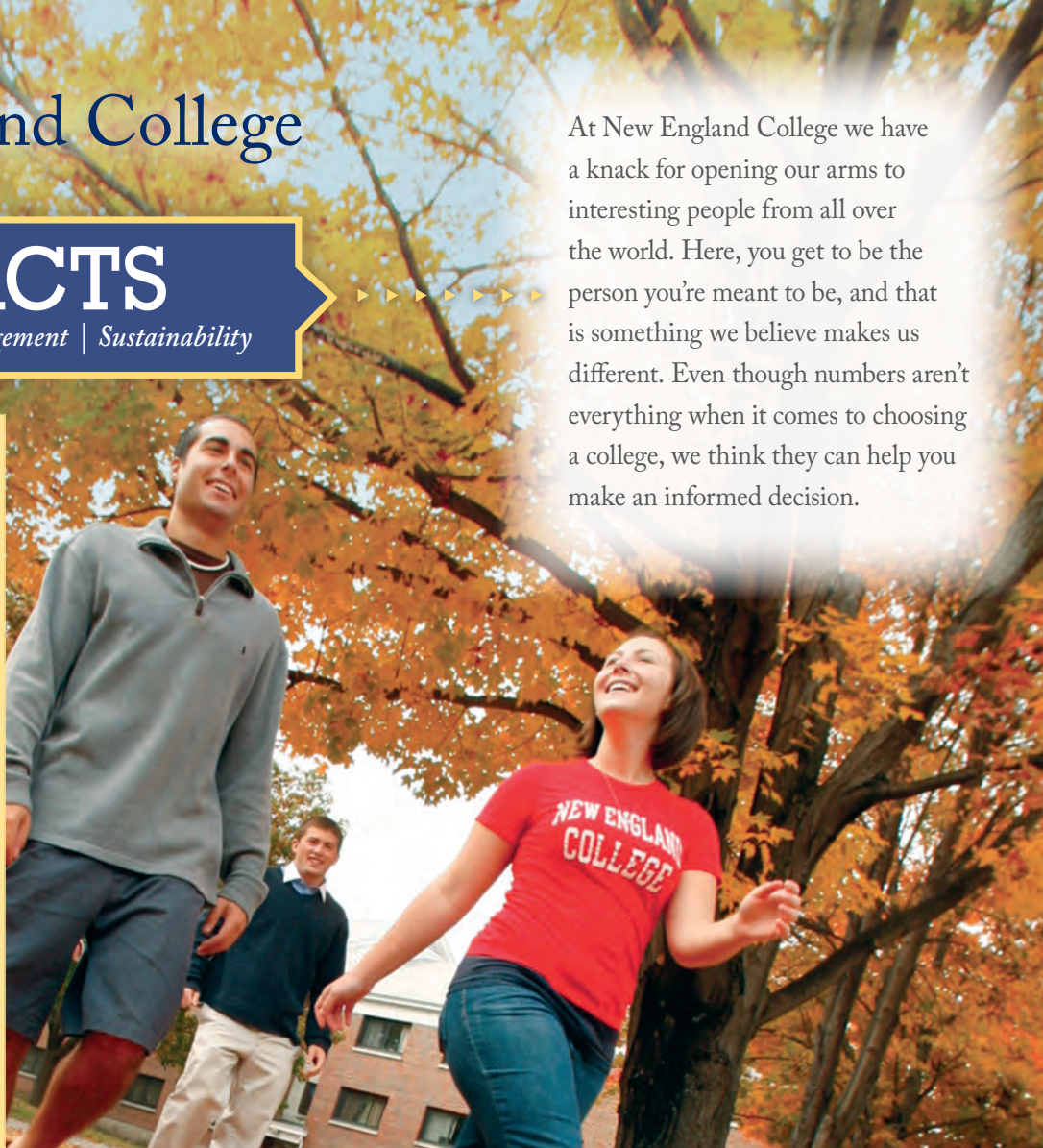

- Apply online – NEC application (www.nec.edu/apply/) or Common Application
- Decision within 2 weeks of complete application
- Testing Optional (choose to send us SAT/ACT scores, or not)
- No application fee
- Average high school GPA: 2.70

Costs and Financial Aid

- 2016-17 Tuition and Fees: \$35,952
Average Room and Board: \$13,536
TOTAL: \$49,488
- Average total financial aid package (scholarships, loans and work study) = \$32,473
- Average NEC grants and scholarships = \$21,433
- File FAFSA (code 002579) after October 1, 2016. NEC and Federal aid available.
